June 8, 2026

Call to Order

- Mayor Robert Post called the meeting to order at 6:00pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- Mayor Robert Post, Vice Mayor Wanda Satterwhite, Council member Bill Boswell, Council member Steven Koehlke, and Council member Debra Artz were present for the meeting. All Council members were present for the meeting.

Mayor & Council Agenda

Approval of Minutes for May 11, 2026 meeting

- Vice Mayor Wanda Satterwhite made the Motion to Approve the May 11, 2026 Minutes and Council member Steven Koehlke Seconded the Motion. The May Minutes were unanimously approved and recorded.

Approval of the Treasurer's Reports – June 2026

- Council member Debra Artz made the Motion to Approve the Treasurer's report and Vice Mayor Wanda Satterwhite Seconded the Motion. The June 2026 Treasurer's report was unanimously approved and recorded.

New Business

- Ordinance: Regulating the Discharge of Firearms Within the Town of Between Jurisdiction

- Second Reading/Motion. The purpose of the ordinance is to restrict the discharge of firearms within the Town of Between. This ordinance was amended as a result of input from town residents at the April 2026 council meeting.
- Council member Bill Boswell made the Motion to Approve the Discharge of Firearms Ordinance and Council member Steven Koehlke Seconded the Motion and it was unanimously approved.

- FY 2026 Operating Budget Reconciliation Process
 - The Operating Budget Reconciliation document will be presented to the council for approval at the July 13, 2026 council meeting. The proposed budget will be sent to the council members via E-mail prior to that date.

Updates

- Legacy Electric Expansion
 - The foundation and floor of the second building of the Legacy Electric expansion on Royal Park Drive have been completed. This 10,000 sq ft building will house two new businesses. The first space is already under contract.
- Package Store
 - The outer shell of the building has been completed with interior work beginning. Framing and electrical will be started inside soon.
- KEMCO
 - The structural steel erection and outer shell have been completed for this facility and the end of Rosewood Circle.

- ASAP Concrete Construction
 - The structural steel for this facility has been completed.
- The Snellville Heating and Air Conditioning building on Nunnally Farm Road has been sold to All Turf Lawn Care. They have applied for their business license.

Town Hall Rental Update

- Council member Bill Boswell gave an update on the highly sought after Between Town Hall rental. During the month of June, the Town hall is rented to capacity all weekends for a variety of functions. There are 23 more confirmed bookings already booked through the end of this year including some in November and December. Just a reminder, the Town Hall can be rented for a Full day (8 hours) and the facility includes tables, chairs, and also the OpenAir pavilion for the low cost of \$125.00.
